This could include issues such as a conflict of interest in a police service investigating one of its own members, whether due to their rank or the sensitivity of the issue; or corruption; or other issues that may arise that are unique and different and may be of concern to the local Police Commission, Committee or other police governance body or should be red flags to the oversight body, signalling a time when they may want to contact ASIRT themselves. Also, what oversight bodies can expect from ASIRT when it conducts an investigation. This would include a report of the final outcome of the investigation or other communication from ASIRT.
